


Thursday, November 23rd, at Joséphine Baker, a "Thanksgiving" day was organized like in America.

This day was organized to honor the American origins of Joséphine Baker and to pay homage to the kindness she showed during her life and to all the things she brought to the table.






WORLD NEWS TRUMP'S SECOND TERM IN THE PIPELINE?

The next US presidential election will take place in November, 2024. While Joe Biden will finish his first term, Donald Trump is determined to get reelected for the second time and is already the highest in the polls.

US elections are close, and we all wonder who will be elected in 2024. But how do they really work? In the US, the voting system is different from the French one. Firstly, the election is indirect, this means that every state votes for electoral colleges which themselves vote for a candidate. Those candidates are mostly from 2 parties: the Republican party and the Democratic party. However, candidates can sometimes be independents such as Robert F. Kennedy Jr., nephew to former president John F. Kennedy, who is running in the 2024 elections. Moreover, voters will also elect new members of Congress, 435 Representatives and 33 Senators who make up the legislative branch, at the same time as the presidential election.

Currently, Trump is first in the polls and Biden ranks second. But why aren't new faces reaching higher places in the polls? Firstly, established politicians, especially those who have previously been president, often have higher name recognition. Voters may be more familiar with these candidates, making them more likely to appear in polls. Secondly, candidates with established political careers tend to receive more media coverage, increasing their visibility.



If Donald Trump gets elected, his term would be much more radical than his first one. He wants the administration and the Justice department to be managed by close friends of his. Regarding the economy, he wants to introduce a 10% tax on imports, particularly from China, and on an international level, he wants to stop the war in Ukraine quickly and doesn't want to protect the members of NATO. In conclusion, his election would be a major shift for the US and for the world internally, economically and internationally.

SANDRA DAY O'CONNOR, FIRST WOMAN ON SUPREME COURT, DEAD AT 93



Sandra Day O'Connor was the first woman to serve on the U.S. Supreme Court. She was appointed by President Ronald Reagan in 1981 and worked until her retirement in 2006 and she was dead Friday December 1 at the age of 93 in Phoenix, Arizona.

Her appointment was historic, as it broke a long tradition of male judges in this institution. Ronald Reagan wanted to elect a woman in order to have more diversity in the Supreme Court. There were only men and he wanted to change that.

Preserving Roe vs. Wade

After her, five other women justices were appointed to the Supreme Court, four of whom are currently in office, a record for this institution. Out of the 9 members of the Supreme Court, there are 4 women: Ketanji Brown Jackson , Amy Coney Barrett , Elena Kagan, and Sonia Sotomayor.

Abortion was once a crime in different states. Roe vs. Wave is the most well-known decision of the U.S. Supreme Court. On January 22, 1973, Roe vs. Wade granted American women the right to abortion throughout the country, and when that right got threatened in 1989, she helped save it. The decision was eventually overturned in 2022, though, when Trump appointed new conservative justices.

CLIMATE CHANGE THREATENS THE WORLD: WHAT TO EXPECT?

Major water sources continue to dry, a decrease between 1913 and 2017 by 9%, and it continues to decrease slowly. The Southwest part of USA faces a future with less water and more wildfires. Climate change is reducing the flows of Colorado significantly and in the entire world basically. The consequences are hard to manage.

First we have wildfires, they generally start because of many things like dry weather, human activities and dry vegetation for example. When the trees burn, they immediately release carbon dioxide into the atmosphere, which in turn contributes to climate change.

In 2020, there were around 1062 wildfires in Colorado. It represents a danger for the population around. Many regions in the world, like Sahel and lake Chad in Africa, are experiencing water scarcity and a decline in available water resources while others are experiencing floodings. Droughts lead to complications like less food availability to the population, an increase in food prices so less options because it



touches agricultural production. Flooding leads to the displacement of the population so we have more and more climate refugees.

There is the environmental impact of course: floods damage infrastructures, homes, roads... 20% approximately of agricultural lands worldwide are affected by floods, this is the same number for droughts. Because of the global warming, in many cold places where there is a lot of snow and ice, they meet a major problem that is the melting of the ice. This is a big issue that we have trouble to manage correctly because it directly leads to the rising sea levels in many parts of the world. Since the beginning of the 20th century, the level of the sea has risen by 20 centimeters globally! If we can't succeed in reducing greenhouses gas emissions, sea levels could rise by 30 to 110 centimeters more by 2100 (*According to IPCC*).

THE "ZOMBIE" DRUG: A RISING CONCERN IN THE US

An alarming trend is surfacing which touches everybody in the United States: the "zombie drug." This ominous term is associated with dangerous substances that have a devastating effect on human behavior, plunging individuals into a state of trance, confusion, and sometimes inexplicable violence.



Fentanyl, one of the primary substances involved, emerges as a formidable stimulant, likened to cathinone. Its impact on the central nervous system induces hallucinations, extreme agitation, and hyperthermia, creating alarming scenarios where users exhibit unpredictable behavior, insensitivity to pain, and abnormally heightened strength.

This concerning phenomenon is raising significant concerns among health authorities and law enforcement. Substantial efforts are underway to raise awareness about the dangers of these drugs and fight their illegal trafficking. However, their dynamic nature and availability on the black market and online make this fight complex.

The battle against the "zombie drug" demands a multidimensional approach. Prevention campaigns, stricter regulations, and increased awareness of the devastating effects of these substances are imperative to curb their spread and protect public health.

In essence, the "zombie drug" poses a serious challenge to American society. Its disruptive impact on human behavior calls for concerted action, combining education, prevention, and enforcement measures to safeguard the safety and well-being of communities against this growing threat.

NEW ZEALAND'S NEW GOVERNMENT WILL ABANDON ANTI-SMOKING LAWS


In New Zealand, the new government of Christopher Luxton will roll back the previous law that would have prevented future generations from smoking. They explained it would increase the economy of the country, plus, they said the law didn't make sense. The law against smoking was established for the people born after 2008, so the Government argued it wasn't very logical: why would a 36 year-old be able to smoke down the street, but not a 35 year-old?

The impact is not only on health, but also on the environment. Due to the cigarette butts, the streets get dirtier and there is more probability for fires to start. The climate change has impacted everyone and New Zealand is no exception. The rise of the sea is their main problem there, and if the law against cigarettes isn't voted anymore, the fires could be added to the list of country's problems.

"Hi, I'm Chandler. I make jokes when I am uncomfortable."

The unforgettable Matthew Perry, known for his role as Chandler Bing in *Friends*, died at 54 in his hot tub the 28th of October 2023, in Los Angeles.



The shocking news touched many generations. Indeed, the actor was found inanimate at only 54. According to NBC, the cause of death is "deferred", the results of the autopsy were "inconclusive". Furthermore, no drugs were found. Perry was famous for playing Chandler Bing, one of the most popular characters from *Friends*,

a famous 90's sitcom. Chandler is a character who doesn't really want to grow up, and has a fear of commitment in relationships: "*Until I was 25, I thought that the only response to "I love you" was "Oh, crap!"*". We don't know much about his job, but he was always there for his friends, and he brought joy to people. He became someone that people can relate to and easily appreciate.

Could this be more tragic?

Matthew, just like his character, was the "funny one" in the show, but also backstage. He was a genius of sarcasm and improvisation, even helping the writers of the show with his own hilarious jokes. He ended the show with a perfect sarcastic joke when Rachel asks to get a coffee and Chandler answers: "*Sure. Where?*" But we all know they are going to Central Perk, their hangout for 10 years.

However, Matthew was dealing with severe alcoholism and drug addiction. He said in a CBC Q interview "When I die, I don't want Friends to be the first thing that's mentioned." In fact, he wanted to be recognized for helping people with their addictions. He wrote his memoir to share his struggles called *Friends, Lovers and the Big Terrible Thing* in 2022. He became an actor by following his father's steps. His mom was a Canadian journalist. As a teenager, he loved tennis and considered a career in sport. Because of the divorce of his parents, he lived in Canada and L.A. and went to school with a certain Justin Trudeau! Matthew Perry, a $f_{i} \not\in N \cdot p_{i}$ we will never forget!

HOLLYWOOD BACK IN BUSINESS AFTER 5-MONTH STRIKE



On November 8, actors and studios reached an agreement putting an end to the strike that paralyzed Hollywood. After 118 days, the actors signed a new convention, which includes a minimum wage increase, for the first time a bonus system proportional to the success of the film or series on streaming platforms, and protection against Artificial Intelligence. Furthermore, scriptwriters get better rewarded for creating successful shows.

To respond to the wage concessions offered to the strikers, the industry will have to reduce production, a trend that already existed before the strikes. This is a relief for the studios, even if this historic double strike cost the Hollywood industry \$6 billion. Since the beginning of the strike, SAG-AFTRA collected more than \$15 million destined for actors working daily, who are struggling financially in the absence of film shoots. Since May, screenwriters, followed two months later by Hollywood actors, had been voicing their dissatisfaction with the movie industry. Thousands of screenwriters, actors, stuntmen and other professionals demanded higher wages, but also protection for their work against artificial intelligence - in a nutshell, better working conditions. The movement was first initiated by the Writers Guild of America. Then the actors' union, SAG-AFTRA, announced their alliance with the demonstration. The industry was paralyzed, actors stopped shooting and refused to participate in promotions, causing a delay in upcoming blockbusters and revealing a dysfunction in the Hollywood engine. It's a lesson for an industry that

can sometimes rest too much on its laurels!

#5 Rockin Around The Christmas Tree by Brenda Lee




(FREE) TEACHERS' TIPS!

Ms Talaucher. John Grishman and Ken Follet.


Mr. Filoche. Oscar Wilde's plays. Drama is an excellent way to embrace literature: it can be read, listened to, watched and even played.

Mr. Bonnard. Twain's *Tom Sawyer*, Steinbeck's *East of Eden*, John Fante's *Ask the Dust...*


Ms Talaucher. The Street Lawyer by John Grisham.




What advice could you give to students who are having a hard time learning English?



SCREEN ADDICTION: HOW IT AFFECTS US, AND HOW TO FIGHT AGAINST IT

Phones, computers and tablets, originally made to communicate, have now become a way to be informed, entertained and even to shop online. These technological innovations are now indispensable and have increased a form of dependence among certain people.



Some celebrities like Ed Sheeran, Tom Holland and even pop singer Selena Gomez have decided to take a break from social media to spend more time with their family or to protect their mental health. In fact, the *Spider-Man* movie star said: "*I get caught up and I spiral when I read things about me online and ultimately it's very detrimental to my mental state*". Thus, he decided to delete Instagram and Twitter.

Numeric tools have many functionalities but with their development and mostly the appearance of social media and online games, a new addiction has developed: screen addiction.


This is the excessive and compulsive use of screens which releases dopamine. Dependence is detected when a person constantly uses a phone, for example, and is feeling anxious and nervous or has an aggressive behavior without it.

According to Statistas, in the United States, young consumers between 18 and 40 are more worried about the negative impact of using their phones on their mental and physical state than older ones. And it is potentially because older consumers spend less time on screens. What's more, 46% of Americans take regular breaks away from screens to manage their screen time. However, people know that they spend time on screens, but are not aware of their addiction.

Dr Anna Lembke is an American psychiatrist and Medical Director of Addiction Medicine at Stanford University. She explains that being on a phone gives "the feeling of doing something" and that "it's an illusion." Anna doesn't have a phone, so she is not distracted and wants to be present for her family. But it's also complicated for her when she travels to work. However, she is still happy about her choice. This addiction has many consequences. Indeed, it increases procrastination and



reduces concentration, which has a negative impact on students' learning. Furthermore, it causes sleep problems such as insomnia, headaches and social isolation which affected many people during covid.

There are solutions to deal with screen addiction such as removing applications, doing sport and relaxation to avoid screens. Furthermore, doing simple actions without a phone, for instance, not eating and sleeping with a phone will help. In certain cases, therapy can be considered.


IS A.I. TAKING CONTROL?

On May the 2nd, 2023, Snapchat created My AI, an intrusive chat-bot.

On November the 30th, 2022, OpenAI made Chat GPT.

Then, Canva created its free generator of pictures: in 2 or 3 words, a masterpiece appears.

Artificial Intelligence is everywhere. Is it taking over?



Artificial Intelligence is a robot that imitates humans (their imagination, their knowledge). But can it *replace* humans ? And what are its consequences?

Initially humans created AI because they wanted to automate tasks and improve new technologies.

Then, we can see two kinds of AI: the "weak" AI, which can do a specific action like Siri by Apple, or Chat GPT by Open AI. There is also the "strong" AI, which can do anything and has all the characteristics of humans. However, there aren't many strong AI. According to the online newspaper Le Monde: Artificial Intelligence is poised to profoundly change almost every aspect of our lives.

So, we might think that the AI is going to replace us, but no. AI is only here to help or facilitate human tasks.

In a few years, 80% of existing jobs will disappear. However, this will create other jobs, because it's necessary to have people who maintain, improve or repair the technology.

The US is the biggest consumer of meat after Hong Kong in the whole world, with 124 kilograms per year, which represents an increase of 40% since 1961. Obviously, this excessive consumption of meat has a lot of consequences on health and environment. Firstly, farming, representing 10.6% of the United States (US) greenhouse gas emissions in 2021, is one of the biggest causes of climate change. Indeed, meat production is worse than the car industry for the environment, with 14.5% to 18% of total global greenhouse gas emissions.



According to the seasons, a cow consumes 70 to 150 liters of water per day, which is a very big amount of water. What's more, a cow produces 400 grams of methane per day, the equivalent of a car that travels 20,000 kilometers in one year. Furthermore, beef production is one of the causes of deforestation in the Amazon rainforest, which is nicknamed "The Lung of the Earth" for it produces 20% of the world oxygen. Indeed, the US became Brazil's second buyer of meat with more than 145 millions of kilograms of Brazilian cattle last year. Besides, they buy more and more red meat. In addition, to feed animals, farmers burn the largest rainforest of the world to plant soy, which generates 2 tons of CO2 released in the atmosphere per ton of burnt trees. Indeed, producing meat is dangerous for the environment, but also for people who eat this food in excess. First of all, it can provoke diseases such as obesity and bowel cancer, because of a chemical called "haem" (which is present in beef) that forms "N-nitroso" chemicals in the gut. Then, "N-nitroso" chemicals damage the cells in the bowel.



Furthermore, high saturated fat levels in red meat can contribute to cause heart disease, which is the first cause of death in the USA.

Finally, according to the World Health Organization (WHO) studies, cooked meats could be carcinogenic because of the nitrite that they contain.

If meat has some disadvantages with respect to environment and health, we could replace it with vegetal proteins contained in pulses (beans, peas, lentils) or nuts and seeds.

What's more, contrary to some stereotypes that say eating meat is a sign of masculinity, since it allows to be strong, being vegetarian or vegan doesn't mean that you don't have enough proteins and strength. For instance, some very competitive and famous athletes feel better by being vegan like Formula 1 pilot Lewis Hamilton, as well as tennis players Serena Williams (vegan only during her intense training period) and Novak Djokovic, who once said : *"I do eat plant based and I think that's one of the reasons why I recover well"*.

2024 PARIS OLYMPICS: TEAM U.S.A. EXPECTED TO WIN THE MOST MEDALS

The forecast

Predictions of Gracenote project that the United States will win the most medals at the Paris 2024 Summer Olympics. If the American team does this, the USA will rank first for the eighth consecutive time, with 37 gold, 45 silver and 44 bronze medals.

China is expected to finish second (with 35 gold, 25 silver and 18 bronze medals) Gracenote predicts 78 medals for China, 11 fewer than



the country's total in Tokyo two years ago. Great Britain is expected to improve, arriving third this time, with 17 gold, 24 silver and 25 bronze medals. However Gracenote predicts Great Britain will win fewer gold medals.

With Russia and Belarus banned from international competition, it is not possible to accurately assess the potential performances of Belarus or Russia. So the Russian and Belarusian competitors have been removed from the virtual medal table for the moment.

How athletes prepare for the event

- Athletes have 4 years of preparation but many of them have been preparing for this dream since childhood.
- You obviously need a good diet. Athletes eat a lot of protein, and hydration, often considered the most important factor, also helps prevent injuries.

"My heart breaks for the innocent lives lost in Israel and Palestine"




Lewis Hamilton, the 7 times Formule 1 champion said on October the 20th in a Instagram story that the war between Israel and Palestine broke his heart because he knows that there are lots of innocents who died and who are dying. That's why he gave money to associations that help victims. Lewis supports a lot of causes. He speaks out against children's abuse, he fights for women's rights as well as LGBTQ+ rights,

and he supports the Black Lives Matter movement. That last one holds a very important place in his heart because he is a Black man and he already had been a victim of racism. During his rise to become the best Formula 1 pilot of all times, the star suffered from racism because he was the first and only Black Formula 1 racing driver. WOMEN'S RIGHTS: AN OBLIGATION TO WHICH WE TURN A BLIND EYE

If all human beings are supposed to have the same rights, then why should I be afraid when I leave my house alone? Why is having a child an issue for a woman when she goes to a job interview, but not for a man? Why wouldn't a woman deserve the same salary as a man? What is hidden behind it? A gender? Why must we fight against inequalities in treatment, domestic distribution, sexist discourse, salary inequalities or even a mere lack of consideration?

On December 11, 2023, the Texas Supreme Court overturned an emergency order allowing a woman to terminate her high-risk pregnancy, in a ruling issued hours after her lawyers announced that she had left the state to have an abortion. Doctor says failure to terminate the pregnancy could cause the uterus to rupture in Kate Cox, who is more than 20 weeks pregnant with a foetus with a rare genetic anomaly, complete trisomy 18, which means that he will likely die before birth or live at most a few days, threatening her future

fertility and life. She sued Texas in early December and first won the right to an abortion from Travis County judge. Does this seem normal to you? Not for me. No, it is not normal to have to risk your life to have the right to abortion. Abortion is a right that all women in the world must have. All of them don't have the same means, mentality, the right age, the right context to best welcome a living being. And no, abortion is not murder!



In Louisiana, the decision by a three-judge panel of the New Orleans Circuit Court of Appeals would limit the use of mifepristone, a synthetic steroid that acts against receptors for progesterone, a hormone secreted by the body's corpus luteum the ovary, in the first seven weeks of pregnancy, Instead of 10, and prevent its distribution by mail. The abortion pill should also be prescribed by a doctor.

Anti-abortion groups seek to ban mifepristone, stating that although it's been in use for a long time, it is not safe. The Supreme Court temporarily preserved access to mifepristone, freezing lower court decisions, and the drug remains on the market for now.

"Across the country, we have seen unprecedented attacks on women's freedom to make their own healthcare decisions", the White House announced.

And according to a press release, Joe Biden was "firmly ready to defend the ability for women to access reproductive care".

THE BLEAK MIRROR OF SOCIAL MEDIA



Have you ever had the feeling that everyone is "controlled" or "rated" by their use of smartphones or social medias? Did this question remind you of the famous episode from the *Black Mirror* TV Show *Nosedive*? If you watched it, you could think that it's exaggerated. But today, it's beginning to be real...

Every day, medias tell us that social medias are bad, that teenagers are spending too much time using them, but they don't talk about the real impacts on health. So, I think it's important to tell the truth about it. Firstly, young people's mental health is decreasing. It's the most known issue. A lot of children, even if they don't have the age to use those apps, see older people sharing photos or videos of them with filters. But some people can't realize that they are not real. Then, they start having complexes on their own bodies. In certain cases, it can cause depression and other mental issues.

The attention span of a goldfish

However, there is a bigger problem. Attention span is decreasing very fast. In 2015, Microsoft's research team reported that "*between 2000 and 2015, the average attention span dropped from 12 seconds to 8 seconds, just one second behind a goldfish!*" That means a 4 seconds loss in 15 years! What is the cause of this problem? When you use social medias like TikTok, you only see short videos. You are instantly satisfied because you don't have to wait to see the main information of the video, so it generates a lot of dopamine. And because of dopamine, you want to watch videos for hours, it's a vicious circle! Now when you have to read long articles or listen in class, it's more difficult than before you installed the application. Today, it's a real problem, but few people talk about it.

There is another, well known, issue: cyberbullying. Everyone knows what it is: bullying online. But it's more serious than you think. It causes mental health problems, and some people can kill themselves because of it. There are laws to avoid it, but it's not enough. I think it would be better if medias would talk more about it.

Another underrated problem is fake news. According to UK newspaper The Guardian, the social media where you can find the most fake news is X (formerly Twitter). Nowadays, most teenagers use social medias to get their news. When it's just some false "fun facts" about something, it's okay, but when it comes to world conflicts like the war in Ukraine or the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, it's problematic. With social medias, information, true or false, can travel the world in several hours only! It can cause a lot of disinformation, and people won't believe the truth anymore.
